AUTUMN TERM ACHIEVEMENTS

- · This half term's attendance was outstanding!
- Whole school attendance target for the whole year is 94%
- Whole school attendance year to date is 93.92%
- Whole school attendance for the half term was 95.83%.
- 127 pupils (74%) had attendance of over 94% for the half term!
- 85 pupils (50%) had 100% attendance for the half term

ATTENDANCE AIMS & PRIORITIES

- Target: To maintain whole school attendance at over 94%
- How will we achieve this?: First day response call, home visits, letters home, school meetings with parents, Education Inclusion Plans, pastoral calls home and assemblies.
- House reward system: Celebrating 100% attendance. Pupils achieving 100% attendance for the term will be entered into a draw (one for boys and one for girls). Lucky winners will receive a £50 voucher.
- Consistency: Attedance and Pastoral teams working together to identify barriers to attendance and delivering appropriate actions and interventions to address issues.
- Parental Engagement: Continual communication with families through social media, school website, school displays, school assemblies and parents days.
- Attendance Data: Half termly data analysis procedures to monitor individual pupil attendance. All staff receive weekly class and individual attendance information.
- Letters: Half termly letters to parents / carers where we have attendance concerns.
- Meeting: Arranged meeting with Assistant Head Teacher if attendance concerns continue.
- Local Authority: Local authority involvement if attendance concerns continue.

WHAT CAN YOU DO TO HELP ATTENDANCE?

- It is important your child attends school as regularly as possible.
- Wherever possible, please book medical appointments outside the school day. If this is not possible, we will mark your child as "M" (Medical Appointment).
- Inform school as soon as possible if your child is going to be absent from school.
- If your child is unwell or absent for any other reason, please contact school before 9.15 am on each day of the absence.
- Contact your child's pastoral teacher if you feel your child is unhappy at school.
- Contact Roni Jopling if you feel there is anything we can do to support your child's attendance
