Maths → explore capacity - full, empty, half-full.

- ✓ How many egg cups of water would fill a tea cup? How many tea cups can you fill with a measuring jug of water? Use different containers to investigate and have fun. If the weather is nice you could take it outside!
- ✓ Get groups of containers - can of pop, bottle of juice, any liquids measured in litres or millilitres and put them in order from most to least. Do the tallest containers always contain the most liquid? Repeat for different groups of containers. Take photos as a record or post an image on the school website.

English → how many different words that you think of that describe measures and the size of things - big, huge, centimetre, etc..... how many more can you think of?

Art and DT → make a summer sun and rainbow. You will need paper plate or card, pegs, ribbon or colour paper strips, scissors, glue, colouring pens or pencils.
